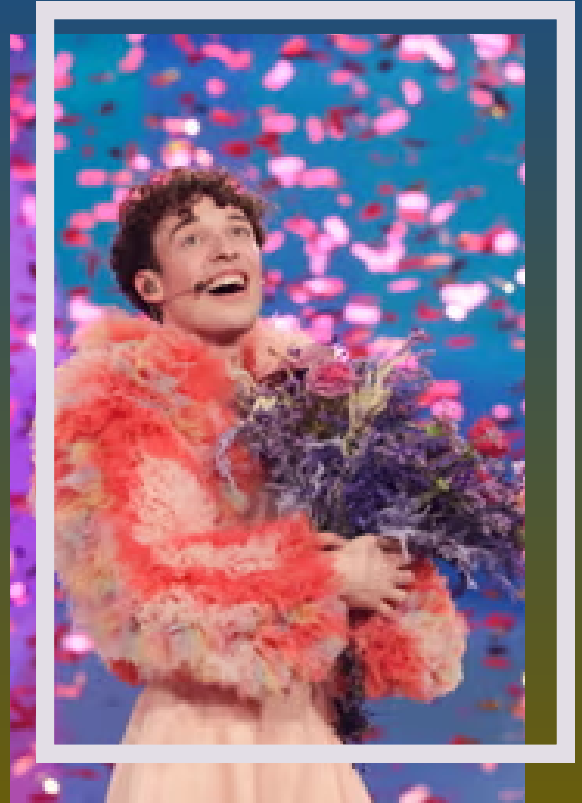
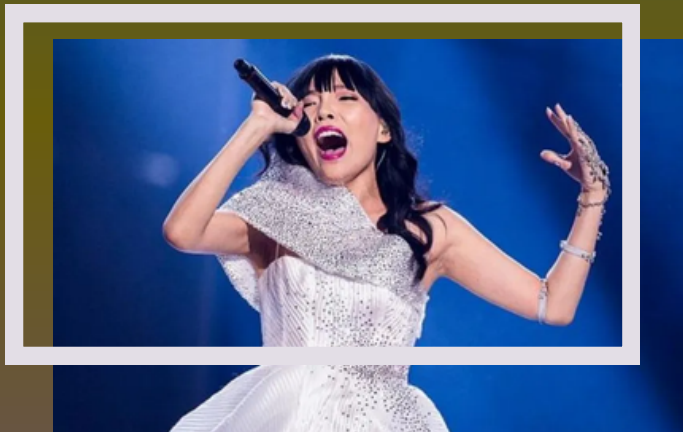

# EUROVISION

Eurovision is a singing contest where countries from Europe and a few from outside Europe, including Australia, send singers to compete. It's been happening since 1956 and is one of the oldest contests in the world. It's like the Olympics for pop music, full of fun and celebrating how music brings people together.



Many countries join, in solo singers or bands, who sing in any style or language. The winner is chosen by a mix of voters from around the world and music-industry experts. The best Australian result so far has been from Dami Im, the artist of 'Sound of Silence'. The first winner of the song contest was Lys Assia in 1956, she still stands as a prominent figure in the history of Eurovision thanks to her song 'Refrain'.

The 2024 Eurovision was held in Malmo, with the winner Nemo, a Swedish artist, with his song 'The Code'.
