Overall, the students were well prepared for NAPLAN examinations with their laptops, earphones and a focused effort. Well done!

Thank you to the staff who administered these examinations, including our teaching and technology support staff, who ensured that devices were ready and provided on-the-spot trouble shooting throughout the week. We look forward to analysing these results as they become available from ACARA in the coming months.




ATOMI

This year, TPHS has signed up for Atomi, an online video and practice exam platform designed to support student learning. This platform covers a wide range of subjects from Year 7 through to Year 12. Students are automatically assigned to their classes within the platform. Once logged in, students have access to short videos aligned to NSW syllabi, quizzes and practice exams.

Atomi also has a series of wellbeing and study videos to support students. There is also a blog which contains useful tips and tricks on topics such as;

Science at TPHS

Stage 5 Science has blasted off for 2023! Students have been looking at a range of topics including energy, atoms, electricity, and chemical reactions. This has involved students creating their models, testing chemical reactions, and applying real-world concepts through electrical circuits and equipment. Students have spent many lessons in the labs where they have applied their practical skills and worked successfully in groups.

Both year groups have also completed their first assessment tasks for the semester. Year 10 students tapped into their creative and analytical minds, designing, and conducting their own experiments at home. Year 9 students demonstrated scientific skills through analysing data, drawing circuits, and producing graphs.

Year 10 will be heading into their physics topic next, 'On the move', where they will look at objects in motion and Newton's three laws. Both topics so far have given students a taster for what they can expect in Senior Chemistry and Physics. Year 9 will look at the structure and movement of the tectonic plates on earth, as well as the effect of both earthquakes and volcanoes.

Students can be seen here in the modelling electron arrangement and testing for chemical change in the images (Year 10).
















Pulse Alive 2023

Congratulations to all of the dancers involved in this event and all of the teachers who assisted in making this excursion possible.






























Advanced visual Arts Excursion

On Monday 13 March, our Year 10 Advanced Visual Arts class embarked on a trip to the Art Gallery of NSW. The purpose of our excursion was to participate in a workshop related to the sculptures in the entrance courtyard of the new North Building and view Art Express, an exhibition of selected Visual Arts HSC works from the 2022 HSC.

On arrival, we were greeted by two gallery educators, who introduced our group to the sculptures, Here Comes Everybody, by Francis Upritchard. These towering humanoid sculptures are entwined with the architecture. They reflect the concept of the art gallery as attracting and welcoming all, as well as the physical environment of the twisting limbs and roots of the surrounding Moreton Bay Figs. We were encouraged to explore the texture, colour, and figurative qualities of the forms before heading inside the new building to the workshop space. The new gallery space is awe-inspiring – expansive, light filled and encompassing incredible views across Woolloomooloo and Sydney Harbour. It was challenging to focus on the art at times!

The art workshop was specifically related to Francis Upritchard's practice. The students were able to view, touch and smell the materials that Upritchard used in the multi-faceted development of her magnificent sculptures. Students were encouraged to work collaboratively with a team, drawing on the strengths of each participant, to design their own creature and then create it using clay. The teamwork was inspiring to observe, and the students designed and constructed fascinating and well-refined pieces in a very short period of time.

After a brief lunch outside the Art Gallery, we entered the older South Building for Art Express. Students were able to view examples of each of the expressive forms that can be created for the Visual Arts HSC. There was many conversations and awe, as our students explored the variety of concepts and materials that Year 12 students employed to create some sophisticated and interesting artworks.

One student's perspective on the day is: I found the practical part of the workshop one of the best parts of the excursion. It was much different compared to any other excursion I have been on. I also found the part where we looked around HSC fun, as we were able to take in each artwork at our own pace. Shania P.


Any payment links that you have previously received from School Bytes, can still be used. However, when you click the link, you will automatically be redirected to the new payment system to either log in or create a new account.

This year, students in Year 7-10 will be involved in the mandatory subject Personal Development, Health, and Physical Education (PDHPE). This subject prepares and supports students to lead, and contribute to, healthy, safe, and meaningful lives which promote respect, responsibility, enjoyment, inclusion and social justice for self and others.

Our school's PDHPE program covers a wide range of education matter, including relationships, drug use, sexuality and sexual health, body image, mental health and wellbeing, protective strategies, movement skills and performance, safety, and physical activity. Some of the content of the program deals with sensitive issues. The school recognises this by teaching about these issues within the context of a developmentally appropriate program and by providing information to you about the program.

The school program will be implemented in a manner that supports the role of parents and caregivers and reflects the ethos of the school community.




