Deputy Principal's Report



Term 2 is in full swing and we are over the mid-term hump heading into reporting season. Last week saw a swath of exams across the school that will guide the teaching staff in writing student reports.

Year 10 are at a crucial stage of their school life: selecting their course pattern for the HSC. They participated in a "HSC Market Day" last Tuesday where they heard from each Head Teacher about what they have to offer in their faculty. On Tuesday 11 June, this event will be supported by the "Subject Selection Evening" in the school hall. This is an opportunity for parents and student to talk with teachers regarding course patterns and possible outcomes for university placements.

Year 10 students participated in a Brainstorm production this week focused on student wellbeing. These productions are a mixture of well-timed jokes and social commentary designed to focus students on issues that affect them on a daily basis. The students enjoyed the production and there were many rich discussions after the event with students who sought clarity on some the topics from the production.

Staff are currently busy writing half yearly reports for all year groups. This is a rigorous process with staff engaged in reflection around the progress of their students. Year 11 reports will be the first to be issued later next week or into the following week. These will be emailed to the email address provided when students enrolled. CAREERS

Greater Western Sydney Careers Market



Twelve students travelled to the Greater Western Sydney Careers Market on Wednesday 22 May and were engaged in robust discussions with industry heads, tertiary providers and employment agencies.

The Market provided a forum for enquiring about interest areas and for picking up some freebies along the way. All students enjoyed themselves and individually were appreciative of the opportunity that this excursion offered.

Tertiary Visits

Since the last Newsletter both Macquarie University and the University of Wollongong have visited the school. Both of these universities offer Adjustment Factors to our students to help the transition to tertiary study possible. These visits have been happening throughout Term 2 in D.G.31 at Recess. We look forward to welcoming both Notre Dame University and Torrens University in the next fortnight.

These visits provide the opportunity to find out about university lifestyle, courses and early entry pathways.



There is also the opportunity for students to ask those pointed questions that they have about their future study options. So far we have hosted WSU, ACU, UNSW, Sydney University, Macquarie University and University of Wollongong.

The Macquarie University visit was particularly important as our students were given 5 location adjustment factors as a result of our partnership with our local university.



Subject Selection

Students have been addressed by Faculty Head Teachers to inform them of their subject options for Year 11 and 12. This will be followed by the Parent Subject Selection Evening on Tuesday 11 June, at 6 pm. Please be aware:

- Subjects this year include: three **Vocational Education and Training Options** within the school as well as a variety of EVET (Externally Provided Educational and Training) options.
- Students have also received a booklet from UAC in their Career Classes titled '**Steps to University for Year 10 Students.**'
- Students have spent time in Careers Lessons discovering the **difference between ATAR and the HSC** as well as learning the requirements of both. In this lesson students were shown patterns of study that were both ATAR and Non-ATAR and discussed why both are valid pathways.
- All students and parents will receive **the Subject Selection Booklet** at the Parent Subject Selection Evening on Tuesday 11 June.
- **SBAT Information Session:** Students interested in doing a SBAT (School Based Apprenticeship or Traineeship) whilst doing their HSC should attend an information session at 5.15 pm on Tuesday 11 June with the SBAT coordinator (Nirimba TAFE). This will be held at the school immediately before the Subject Selection evening. - **EVET Options:** In addition to the VET options within the school students have the alternative of studying a VET course delivered by external providers. Students interested in this choice will have the opportunity to listen to a talk by Melanie Creamer from TAFE Nirimba at the Subject Selection Evening. Melanie will be around afterwards to answer any questions that individuals may have.
- **UAVAIR:** This group have been teaching a Certificate III in Aviation to our Year 11 students and could potentially offer this course next year. Anyone interested in this course should speak to Jenny Livingstone from this group. She will be available for questions following talks on the Subject Selection Evening.

Job Jump

Students were shown that there are two excellent ways for exploring their subject choices for 2020 Year 11. The first of these can be found at the following link: www.jobjump.com.au
This link allows students to explore what subjects are prerequisites, assumed knowledge or highly recommended for a particular career path. Students will need to log in before using this site using the password 'ponds.' This is a service that the school pays for so it is highly recommended that this is used in the decision making process for subject selection. This website is also an excellent way of exploring post-school course options when you go to the My ATAR tab at the top of the page.

PCYC Program for Future Apprentices

The school is very proud of the work that its students have been involved in at the Police Citizens Youth Club's program 'Fit for Work.' All five students are being linked with employers for work placement that could result in real employment. This program has been monitored closely by the Careers Department and all five students have been commended for their involvement. They will graduate from the program on Thursday 4 July.

Year 11 Keep the Date Free - Wednesday 28 August

- The school is partnering with Cherrybrook Technology High School to deliver a tertiary experience to our students.
- This will be a career market that will operate between 6-8 pm on this date.
- Students will need to register their interest for this with the Careers Adviser. A bus may be organised for this event or parents can take students to the expo themselves.
